SERVICE AREA: Northeast Ohio

MISSION: To provide premier hearing, speech-language, and deaf programs and services resulting in a community where everyone communicates effectively.

PROGRAMS:

- Hearing tests, evaluations, hearing aids fitted and sold. Financial assistance program for hearing aids for those who qualify.
- Speech, language, reading, writing evaluations. Individual and group therapy.
- Specialized programs for: teens who stutter, stroke survivor's support group, parent-toddler speech playgroup, adult enrichment, accent modification.
- Community Center for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (CCDHH): includes new Learning Center to improve job-readiness skills; American Sign Language (ASL) classes; interpreters available 24/7; and Sign Stage, an artistic theater program for deaf and hard of hearing students.

MISSION: To empower people with vision loss to realize their full potential and to shape the community's vision of that potential.

PROGRAMS: Cleveland Sight Center is a CARF accredited non-profit agency founded in 1906 that provides preventative, educational, rehabilitative, and other services for individuals who are blind or have low vision, directly serving approximately 14,000 clients annually and many more indirectly through community outreach programs.

In addition, CSC also offers social and recreational activities for clients, hosts camping sessions at its summer camp Highbrook Lodge in Chardon, Ohio, has an on-site Vision Clinic specializing in low vision and routine exams, as well as a retail store featuring products for living well with vision loss.

SERVICE AREA: Cuyahoga, Lorain Counties
MISSION: To promote shalom (peace, well-being) and justice (right relationships)
